PAUL KUENNING'S CORONAVIRUS UPDATE

Several facilities in the county are known to have the virus as it comes closer and closer. We are striving to keep it out. Each day we do not have the virus in our community is a great day!

If we ever have a case of the virus within the Fairhaven/Prairie Village community, the residents of Fairhaven and Prairie Village, families and community would be advised.

As we continue our Focus on PREVENTION, the Staff meet regularly to develop contingency plans in the even an outbreak would occur.

We understand that the primary mode of the virus transmission is contact with another person, or from any bodily fluids such as speaking, sneezing coughing, or touching something that is common and has not been sanitized.

Reminders:

Residents should continue social distancing 6 feet apart or more, wash hands often, use gel if necessary, limit the use of common spaces and gatherings. Walking outside should be done keeping distances from anyone. Wear mask and gloves in public spaces. Please contact your primary Care Physician in the event you begin to have any symptoms.

The Residents "Keep Us Safe" fund has raised over \$5,000 for purchasing the protective equipment needed for our staff. It is so greatly appreciated. To date we believe we have enough equipment on hand but know it would go very quickly in the event of an outbreak.

Work continues at the New Prairie Village Community Center. Interior insulation has now been done and walls are awaiting drywall. On the exterior lighting and siding have been placed. Bid request have been put out for appliances, furnishings, artwork, and landscaping plan is being reviewed before requesting bids.

Main Campus C building elevators are now being worked on for the long-awaited repair. It is expected the repairs and updating will go on till July. The elevators components are of the 1984 vintage.

PRAIRIE VILLAGE GARDENERS

Manure has been spread across the garden thanks to the help of Bob Aulik and Jake Gerlach. Rototilling is scheduled to be done before the end of April (weather permitting). <u>After that</u>, we will "set up" the garden – marking the 14 separate rows of the garden and an east to west string marking the <u>halfway</u> point across each row. A "map" of each family's assigned spot will be placed later in the "Coffee House" and on the seat in the covered shelter outside the garden.

IMPORTANT: If you have <u>not yet requested</u> space in this year's garden, please contact Jake or Hans ASAP. Let us know if you want a smaller spot, $\frac{1}{2}$ a row or a full row (6'X50'). <u>Deadline</u> is Friday, May 8, 2020. After that day, unassigned space will be divided among those gardeners who have requested more than $\frac{1}{2}$ a row.

We are all anxious to start planting, but please <u>wait until the row markers are set</u> <u>up</u> - your space will be <u>between</u> the row assigned you (e.g. row 10) and the next higher number (e.g. Row 11). The Sunday, April 26th issue of The Milwaukee Journal Sentinel offered this planting advice: "cool" season crops (ex. Lettuce, spinach, radishes, beets, peas) can be planted in late April; "warmer" season crops (ex. Tomatoes, peppers, egg plants, melons and squash) end of May or early June.
