Residents of the Month – Joe and Karin Campbell

Fairhaven residents Barb and Dale Green nominated Joe and Karin: "Dale and I would like to nominate Joe and Karin Campbell for residents of the month. They were first to welcome us to Fairhaven, inviting us to pre-dinner drinks and then out to eat with them. They do this for all of us. When people are having a difficult time they are there with a hand-written note under the door or an invitation to play a game. They always stop to chat when we meet them in the hall."

When Joe and Karin moved to Fairhaven in August, 2018, it was a bit of a homecoming. Joe's parents, Jeff and Laura Campbell were Fairhaven residents with Joe and Karin as regular visitors. The "original" Campbells moved in in 1991. Jeff spent his last five years here, while Laura was here for a total of ten years.

About a year ago, Karin's "Putting Things into Perspective" was published in The Banner. It was her reflections on the early days of the lockdown. Here are some still very relevant thoughts from that essay: "Yes, we are on lockdown, but we can still see each other and talk – granted at a 6 foot distance. We miss our family and friends that cannot come in, but mail, phones, and all kinds of communication are available to us on the computer with staff helping us, if need be. ..We have radio and TV, where you can listen and watch everything you want...The kitchen staff is bringing hundreds of meals to the apartments and rooms as ordered. Just think of the planning for that. It makes me glad I am old." And we are glad to celebrate Joe and Karin's kindness and contributions to Fairhaven.
