### **Note from Paul Kuenning:**

Fairhaven Covid status

At Fairhaven and Prairie Village we are certainly seeing some wonderful news when comes to relaxing Covid restrictions. As we open, we continue to monitor appropriately with guidance from CDC, Centers for Medicaid and Medicare, Wisconsin Public Health, and our Medical Director. No doubt it's slower than some would like.

Currently, visitation opportunities at the main campus have been relaxed, please check our website for current guidelines. Under review is opening for volunteers, massage therapy, beauty shop, social events, and appropriate gatherings.

Underlying concerns being monitored is the positivity rate within our counties are going up, along with a concern of how vaccinated persons will be impacted by the variants.

As you are out in the larger community or using the new Community Center, remember to social distance, wear mask and limit group size and wash hands.

Main Campus

At the main campus staffing and occupancy continue to be a concern. Qualified, trained staffing and availability is very difficult to find in the quantity needed for all service areas. Third floor skilled remains closed. Occupancy, at this time, is also down due to the COVID closures. Occupancy is 35 of 82 in skilled care floor 2, 14 of 23 for 4<sup>th</sup> floor assisted living, and 19 of 24 Hearthstone Memory Care. Apartments -- we currently have 30 units open. We are reviewing our marketing plan with the Board as we review opening post COVID. Some services will be delayed or slowed in starting up again due to the availability of staff.

Prairie Village continues to show strong interest as we continue to plan for new units in 2021. We have seen a large increase in the costs of building as well as increases in the values of those selling their homes. Costs of building materials and maintenance supplies have a longer wait time than we have experienced.

### **Spring Clean-up**

BK Properties Management and staff will begin the clean up shortly. We have an agreement with them for the next season to continue to manage this. This agreement is reviewed each season change.

Cloute Inc. window cleaning is scheduled starting May 25. Information will go out shortly about interior cleaning. Information will also go out about additional services you may wish to request.

### **Geese**

We are in the process of making contact with the DNR to review options and steps appropriate to take in reducing the goose population. We are hopeful we will be able to use any resource available and approved by the DNR.

The class will first start in May.

## **2021 GARDENERS**

It is time to start thinking about our summer garden. We spread the 4 loads of composted manure that Hans Hahn got for us last fall. I hope to get maintenance to rototill the garden sometime in late April or early May. After that we will be laying out the rows and closing the fence. Following Fairhaven policy, I want to make sure that every Prairie Village resident that wants a plot will get one. To start, everyone who wants to garden will be given a half row (6'x25') (smaller plots are available). Then I will assign a full row to anyone who wants one. If at any time there is insufficient ground to meet the demand, I will use a lottery system to assign the plots. To the extent possible, continuing gardeners will have the same plot as last year. This approach allows a gardener to develop a plot by fertilizing etc. to improve the soil. **IMPORTANT** I need the names of those who want to have a planting area in the 2021 garden. One of our neighbors has graciously donated a large collection of Military History and World War II magazines. They're currently on the shelves below the large print books.

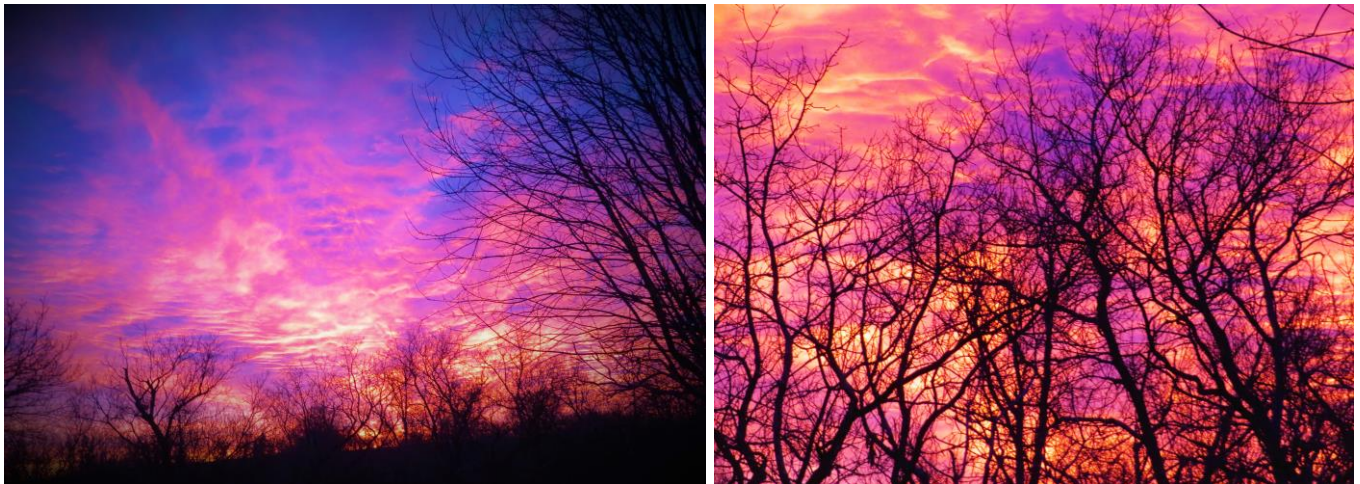
### Puzzles
