Window Washing at Fairhaven

Cloute Window Washing will be at Fairhaven to do the spring window washing (inside and out) starting on Monday, May 10. We will be starting in the C building and then work our way throughout the rest of the buildings. The order will be 4C-3C-2C E2-D2-E1-D1-B-A- 3AA-2AA-1AA. As in previous years, housekeeping will be moving your furniture away from the windows so the crew from Cloute Window Washing can wash your windows. Housekeeping will then put everything back in place once they are done.

David Yochum is our Resident of the Month

Brian Robinson, Leisure Services, nominated Prairie Village resident David Yochum. “I would like to recommend David Yochum as the resident of the month for his continued volunteering within Leisure Services and Transportation Services. David has helped us out in “times of need” when extra transportation requests; both local and outside of Whitewater; have come up and he has dusted off his Trishaw Vest and is once again Piloting rides for those here in the Apartments, Assisted Living and Skilled Nursing. On top of all of this, David has also been part of a group from Whitewater Congregational UCC that has been putting together weekly services that I have been able to put up on our in-house channel throughout COVID.”

David, in turn, provided the following information about himself, his activities and his family.

“David Yochum retired from Fairhaven Retirement Community in Whitewater, WI in 2009 after serving 21 years as Chaplain and Executive Director. During his work at Fairhaven, he led the organization through 3 construction projects: expansion of the C Building, construction of Hearthstone Memory Care, and development of Prairie Village.

During his tenure at Fairhaven, he also served on the Board of Directors and as President of the Wisconsin Association of Homes and Services for the Aging, now known as Leading Age Wisconsin. Since Retirement he has served terms on the Board of Directors and President of Back Bay Mission (a United Church of Christ Social Service Ministry in Biloxi, MS) and on the Board of Directors and Secretary of the Whitewater Community Foundation. David has been a long-time member of Rotary & during the COVID 19 pandemic has become adept at videoing the Congregational United Church of Christ On-Line worship services.

He frequently serves as a Fairhaven volunteer driver. You may also see him cycling in town and through Prairie Village on a pedicab with Fairhaven’s “Cycling Without Age” program.

In 2008 he bicycled from New Orleans to Minneapolis along the Mississippi River and enjoys photography, hiking, and cross-country skiing. After retirement, he became in local Amateur Radio obtaining a General Class license. He and Marcia have enjoyed traveling domestically and in Australia, New Zealand, Nova Scotia with Roads Scholar programs and other tours.

David was raised in Pennsauken, New Jersey, and earned a BA at Ohio Wesleyan University and a Master of Divinity from Andover Newton Theological School. He served local congregations for 17 years in Columbus, NE, Ogallala, NE, and Clinton, IA before coming to Fairhaven.

David and Marcia, his wife of 49 years, have two children, Steven who lives with his wife Sarah and their two children in Chanhassen, MN, and Jeff and his wife Angie and their twin newborn children (April 2021) who live in Muskego, WI.”
