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COVID-19 UPDATE - August 6, 2021

To All Residents, Family members and Responsible Parties:

**2<sup>nd</sup> Floor Skilled Nursing Care** residents are now out of quarantine. Testing for the last two weeks has shown no positive results for both residents and staff. Staff and residents will continue to be tested for two additional weeks. Staff continue to be required to wear goggles and mask.

**2<sup>nd</sup> Floor Skilled Care** residents' activities, spousal visits, family visits, beauty shop services may resume. All residents will need to mask when out in hallways and public spaces. Guest and families will be limited to two and are required to mask and answer the entry questions before coming onto the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor and must keep mask on during the visit. Residents may visit with families outside the building 6 feet apart. Visits may also be scheduled for window visits if desired or in the indoor visiting area.

Covid in our area has continued to increase throughout our area. We continue to monitor and are reviewing guidance from CDC and CMS along with our State and County Health Departments.

**4th floor Assisted Living, Apartments:** Should wear mask when in hallways, public or attending social events. All visitors need to check in and out at the front desk and wear mask when visiting in apartments.

**Hearthstone** memory care, Guest and families are limited to two and required to mask and answer the entry questions before entry and keep mask on during the visit. Residents may visit with families outside the building 6 feet apart. Activities, spousal visits, family visits, beauty shop services continue.

For **Prairie Village** Residents using the Community Center should continue to mask, social distance and use hand sanitizer washing hands frequently. One resident reported having Covid on July 20 and no additional cases have been reported.

We would suggest that residents going outside into the larger community wear masks, social distance, and wash hands or use hand sanitizer frequently.
