Helping People with Diabetes Stay Both Healthy and Hearing -

Did you know that hearing loss is twice as common in adults who have diabetes?¹ In addition, recent research shows that U.S. patients with prediabetes blood glucose levels have a rate of hearing loss that is 30% higher than those with normal blood glucose levels.¹

November is American Diabetes Month, which means it's a great time to explore care options for yourself or loved ones who have diabetes.

DIABETES AND HEARING LOSS GO HAND IN HAND - AS WITH CARDIOVASCULAR DISEASE, DIABE-TES SYMPTOMS SUCH AS HIGH BLOOD SUGAR CAN DAMAGE BLOOD VESSELS THROUGHOUT THE BODY, INCLUDING THE SMALL BLOOD VESSELS IN THE EARS. ALONG WITH NERVE DAMAGE, THIS OTHER DIABETES SYMPTOM CAN DAMAGE AUDITORY NERVES & LEAD TO HEARING LOSS. DIABET-IC PATIENTS MAY ALSO TAKE OTOTOXIC MEDICATIONS, LIKE GLYBURIDE, TO MANAGE THEIR DIS-EASE, AFFECTING HEARING & VESTIBULAR FUNCTION.

More people are becoming aware of the link between these two conditions. The American Diabetes Association confirmed that hearing loss is more common in people with diabetes, which means more people are now recommended to visit an audiologist or hearing specialist as part of their routine diabetes care.

People with diabetes should have annual hearing exams as part of their routine health care.
