Total Solar Eclipse in the U.S.

The U.S. will experience a total solar eclipse on Monday April 8, 2024. Who will be able to "see" the total solar eclipse? Below is a map showing the path of totality stretching from Texas northeast through southeast Missouri through Ohio into northern Maine.




Key Points:

- The duration of totality can range from a few seconds to over four minutes.
- Maximum totality duration will occur near the center of the path.
- The Sun will be *partially* blocked out for about two and a half hours total in some locations.
- The eclipse occurs when our Moon blocks the Sun's light.

The image below shows the percentages of the blocking of the Sun's light outside of the totality path.



Of course, one has to hope for little or no cloudiness in their location in order to observe the eclipse. There is no guarantee your location on April 8, 2024, will have clear or nearly clear skies. Below are satellite pictures of the U.S. showing where clouds were located on April 8th in the past 6 years. It appears southwest Texas has a better chance of have little or no clouds on April 8th each year. Other locations are hit or miss.



Good luck observing the 2024 total solar eclipse! The next one will be on Aug. 23, 2044, and is observable only in North Dakota. Montana, Canada and Greenland.
