**National Emergency Preparedness Month**, sponsored by the Federal Emergency Management Agency is held annually in September. The month is set aside to remind all citizens that natural and man-made disasters can strike at any time. It's important to have a planned response when you're at work, on vacation or on the road.

In 2023, 75,104 weather events resulted in 877 deaths and 3,857 injuries. Heat, wildfires, and tornadoes were responsible for the most deaths during 2023. The largest number of reported injuries resulted from heat, tornadoes, and winter weather.

When you face a natural or man-made emergency, try to stay informed through radio, TV or the Internet. In some cases, however, cable, electric and cell phone service will be disabled, making communication nearly impossible.

To keep yourself safe for common emergencies in our area please review what you are to do in case of Tornado, Fire, Electrical Outage(s) and Flash Floods. It is important to always have a flashlight or lantern on hand and in working order, and to make sure your cell phone is fully charged in inclement weather. It is also recommended that everyone has at least three days of food and water, a First Aid Kit in their home, and an emergency kit in their car.

On a final note: Please be sure to store all important documents – birth certificates, insurance policies, etc. – in a fire-proof safe or safety deposit box, and let either a family member, POA, or your emergency contact know where these items are located.
