Employees Christmas Fund Update



For many years residents of Prairie Village and Fairhaven have felt it appropriate to remember the employees at Christmas, as Fairhaven prohibits tipping employees by residents. The Employee Christmas Fund was developed in response to this idea.

So, What Happens with Your Employees Christmas Fund Donations?

When you review the entire Christmas Fund process, there are some very well-established steps:

Residents, families, or representatives make donations anytime during the year.

Neil Aiken and Karen Christofferson, the residents who manage the fund year around and report to the Council monthly, make deposits and invest our funds (this year in two certificates of deposits and a money market account).

Once Neil and Karen share the total of our donations in mid-late November with David Gackstatter, he computes the amounts based on total number of employees and individual hours worked. Once those amounts are agreed upon, a group of your fellow residents stuff the envelopes with cash from the bank, which are given to employees on the next pay day.

But what happens then? Employees can spend the money anyway they please and probably much of it goes to gifts for family and friends. Several employees recently volunteered how they have used theirs in recent years, in addition to gift-giving:

"I bought perennial plants in the spring so every time I see them, I think of Fairhaven."

"I took my child on an overnight Lake Geneva Christmas trip. I bought tires for my car."

"I paid medical bills."

"I donated to charity."

"I decorated my Dad's hospital room."

"I replaced my 17-year-old microwave."

"I don't know what I would have done without that money since I had to have my car's transmission fixed to get to work."

Several employees used it to pay bills.

"I spent it on special gifts for my grandkids and shopped with as many local businesses as possible."

"I take my family out for a nice meal."

"I bought myself a charm which always reminds me of Fairhaven."

Several mentioned how they save it: "put it aside for a rainy day which I certainly needed this year"; "added to my slush fund and eventually made a big purchase"; and "added to my savings account."

Although we accept contributions at anytime during the year, we would appreciate receiving your donation by November 21, 2025. This can be done by check, cash or monthly automatic debit*. Donations can be given to Neil Aiken at Fairhaven or taken to the front desk. They also can be deposited into the locked box in the Prairie Village Community Center or mailed directly to Karen Christofferson at 873 Burr Oak Trail. Please use a sealed envelope labeled for Employee Christmas Fund. (There are envelopes near the locked box in Prairie Village.) If you would like a tax letter, please note that at the time of donation.

It should be noted that these contributions are anonymous. We will distribute the money to employees in December.

Fall Prevention & Scam prevention

- · Be aware of wet leaves: Autumn leaves become slick when wet, posing a significant slipping hazard on sidewalks and stairs.
- · Improve indoor lighting: Shorter days mean less natural light. Add nightlights in bedrooms, hall-ways, and bathrooms, and ensure switches are easy to reach.
- · Wear sensible, non-slip footwear: Choose supportive shoes with good traction for both indoor and outdoor use. Avoid wearing socks or floppy slippers on slick surfaces like wood or tile floors.
- · Secure loose rugs: Use double-sided tape or non-slip pads to keep area rugs and mats from shifting.
- · Spot common seasonal scams: Be wary of scams that rely on urgency and pressure, such as fake tech support, prize drawings, or government imposter schemes.
- · Never give out personal information: Do not provide your Social Security number, banking details, or passwords in response to unsolicited phone calls, emails, or texts.
- · Have an anti-scam plan: Create a shared password with family members for verification. Never pay with gift cards or wire transfers, and end suspicious communication immediately.
- · Report scams: If you or a loved one is targeted, report the incident to the authorities, such as the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) or the National Elder Fraud Hotline (833-372-8311)


