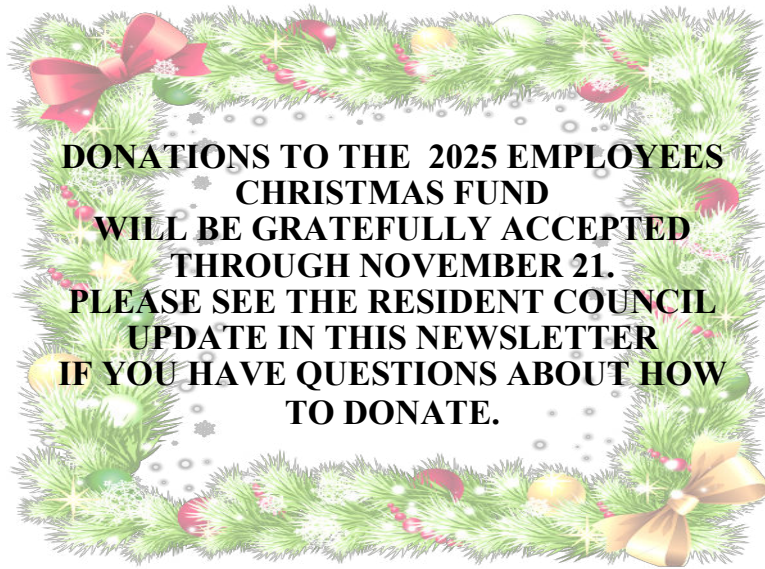

Fairhaven Library Lighting Update

November Safety Topic

Everyday we see friends and neighbors moving around the building in wheelchairs. Some are quite good at moving themselves, and some require more help. While we understand that many of us want to be helpful, residents pushing other residents in wheelchairs is a safety concern and not allowed here at Fairhaven for the following reasons:

· **Injury:**

Pushing a person in a wheelchair can cause musculoskeletal injuries to the resident doing the pushing from overexertion, pushing, pulling, and bending.

· **Improper handling:**

Pushing a person's wheelchair improperly can cause them to fall out or can lead to injury.

Family members and loved ones are considered an exception to this rule. If you see someone struggling in their chair, the best way to help them is to alert a staff member.
